



CHAPTER 14.

An Act to amend the "Chiropractic Act."

R.S.B.C. 1936, c. 38.

[Assented to 3rd April, 1947.]

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Chiropractic Act Amend- Short title.
ment Act, 1947."

2. Section 8 of the "Chiropractic Act," being chapter 38 of Amends s. 8.
the "Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1936," is amended by adding the following provisos to subsection (1), as amended by section 3 of chapter 10 of the Statutes of 1945:—

"Provided that until the thirty-first day of December, 1948, the following class of persons shall be entitled to apply for registration as chiropractors under this Act and become members of the Association, namely: Those persons who:—

"(a.) Are British subjects or Canadian citizens:

"(b.) Have graduated after the first day of January, 1939, from a school or college of chiropractic, teaching a residence course of three school or college periods of at least six months each; and

"(c.) Have either been members of the Canadian Armed Forces in World War II. or have been prevented by the operation of the 'War Measures Act' of the Dominion from changing their occupation during World War II., and were thereby prevented from attending or continuing their attendance at a school or college of chiropractic:

"And provided further that until the thirty-first day of December, 1947, the following class of persons shall be entitled to apply

for registration as chiropractors under this Act and become members of the Association, namely: Those persons who have graduated from a school or college of chiropractic, teaching a residence course of three school or college periods of at least six months each, before the first day of April 1945, and who have practised chiropractic in any part of the Dominion before the date of application."
