



CHAPTER 85.

An Act for granting certain Sums of Money for the Public Service of the Province of British Columbia.

[Assented to 3rd April, 1947.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN :

WHEREAS it appears by Messages from His Honour Charles Arthur Banks, C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of British Columbia, and the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in the Schedules are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the Province, and for other purposes connected with the Public Service, for the fiscal years ending the thirty-first day of March, 1946, 1947, and 1948, respectively:

May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Supply Act, 1947."
2. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied as set forth in Schedule A a sum not exceeding in the whole three hundred and ninety-two thousand three hundred and fifty dollars and ninety-six cents, to make good certain sums expended for the Public Service of the Province for the fiscal year ended the thirty-first day of March, 1946.
3. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied as set forth in Schedule B a sum not exceeding in the whole two million five hundred and fifty-seven thousand five hundred and sixty-five dollars and twenty-one cents,

4. From and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund there may be paid and applied as set forth in Schedule C a sum not exceeding in the whole fifty-eight million seven hundred and eighty-one thousand three hundred and thirty-four dollars and fifty-two cents, towards defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Province for the fiscal year ending the thirty-first day of March, 1948.

Lapsing of
unexpended
appropriations.

5. (1.) Any part of the moneys appropriated by this Act under Schedules B and C that may be unexpended at the end of the fiscal year for which it is appropriated shall not be expended thereafter.

(2.) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), payment may, subject to the provisions of subsection (3), be made out of such unexpended moneys in respect of liabilities and expenses incurred before the end of the fiscal year.

(3.) Payment pursuant to subsection (2) shall not be made except during such period (not exceeding three months after the end of the fiscal year) as the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may fix for the final closing of the account of the appropriation comprising moneys so unexpended.

6. The said aids and supplies shall not be issued or applied to any purpose other than the purposes for which they are appropriated as set out in said Schedules and in the detailed estimates and votes upon which said Schedules are based, respectively.

Accounting

7. The due application of all moneys expended under the authority of this Act shall be accounted for to His Majesty.
