The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to REPORT:--

THAT on the 9th October, 1922, SAMUEL TAYLOR was convicted at South Vancouver, British Columbia, by Police Magistrate F.T. Johnson, for that he, the said SAMUEL TAYLOR at South Vancouver aforesaid, did unlawfully have in his possession one hen pheasant, and for said offence a fine of \$50.00 was imposed and a Greener shot-gun ordered confiscated.

THAT an application has been made by the said SAMUEL TAYLOR for the return of the said Greener shot-gun.

THAT the Deputy Inspector of Provincial Police, Vancouver, reports -

"..... I would like to add that after consulting Chief Constable Cruickshank and Constable Sharpe regarding the merits of this case we unanimously agreed that Mr. Taylor received sufficient punishment for the offence charged when he was fined \$50.00 by the Magistrate and I have much pleasure in recommending favourable consideration of Mr. Samuel Taylor's application."

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT under the provisions of the "Revenue Act" the said Greener shot-gun be returned to the said SAMUEL TAYLOR.

AND THAT a certified copy of this Minute, if approved, be forwarded to F.R. Butler, Secretary, Game Conservation Board, Vancouver, B.C.
