To His Honour

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

THAT on the 27th day of November last WILLIAM GRAHAM was convicted by the Police Magistrate at Nanaimo for selling beer contrary to the provisions of the "Government Liquor Act" and for such offence, it being a second offence, he was adjudged to pay a fine of Two Hundred (\$200.00) dollars and, in default of such payment, was sent to undergo imprisonment for two months in gaol at Oakalla.

THAT a communication has been received from the Mayor of Nanaimo setting out that the convicted man has a wife and five children in destitute circumstances, that he served four years in France, was twice gassed, from the effects of which he has not yet fully recovered, and requesting a pardon.

THAT the Police Magistrate at Nanaimo reports as follows:--

"I am fully in accord with his release on parole, a further recommendation is the fact this man did 4 years overseas."

THAT the said WILLIAM GRAHAM has already served over one month of his said term.

THE UNDERSIGNED HAS THEREFORE THE HONOUR TO RECOMMEND THAT under authority of Section 9 of chapter 44 of the "Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1911", the unexpired portion of the term imposed on the said WILLIAM GRAHAM be remitted and that the said WILLIAM GRAHAM be discharged from custody.

AND THAT a certified copy of this Minute, if approved, be forwarded to the Warden, Oakalla Prison Farm.
