To His Honour
The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:—

That by section 3 of the "Soldiers' Land Act," being chapter 80 of the Statutes of 1918, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council from time to time to reserve from sale or other disposition, except for the purposes of the said Act, any area of Crown Lands, and to cancel any such reservation either in whole or in part; and that by clause (c.) of section 5 of the said Act, as re-enacted by section 2 of the "Soldiers' Land Act Amendment Act, 1919," being chapter 76 of the Statutes of 1919, it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor in Council to convey, on such terms and conditions as may be deemed advisable, to His Majesty the King in the right of the Dominion or to any person, on request of the Dominion Government, any land reserved under the provisions of said section 3, for the purpose of enabling a Soldier Settlement Board to be appointed by the Dominion Government to settle soldiers or settlers in British Columbia.

And to further report that there has been constituted by the "Soldiers' Settlement Act, 1919," being an Act of the Parliament of Canada, 9-10 George V., chapter 71, a Board under the name of the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada for the purposes referred to in said Act.

And to further report that a request has been made by His Majesty the King in the right of the Dominion of Canada, as represented by the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada, for a conveyance of the N.W.¼ of Lot 2926, Lillooet District, containing 160 acres more or less.

which was reserved for the purposes of the said Act by Order in Council No. 14 of 1923.


And to recommend that the request be granted, and that the said lands be transferred to His Majesty the King in the right of the Dominion of Canada, as represented by the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada, and that the said transfer be

subject to all the terms, conditions, exceptions, and reservations contained in the provisoes set out in Form No. 7B, added to the Schedule to the "Land Act," being chapter 129 of the "Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1911," by section 11 of the "Land Act Amendment Act, 1913," being chapter 35 of the Statutes of 1913.

And to further recommend that a certified copy of this Minute, if approved, be transmitted to the Registrar, Land Registry Office, Kamloops, B.C. to the intent that such certified copy be accepted by him as a conveyance of the said land to His Majesty in right of the Dominion of Canada, as represented by the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada, without further formal instrument of transfer subject to the said provisoes and conditions.

And to further recommend that a certified copy of this Minute, if approved, be forwarded to the Soldier Settlement Board.
