The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to REPORT:

THAT Section 36 of the "Audit Act," being Chapter 7 of the Statutes of 1917, makes provision for fixing allowances for travelling and living expenses of Public Servants.

THAT Major J.W. Clark, Superintendent of B. C. Soldiers' Settlement, was sent to India on the invitation of the Imperial Government, for the purpose of presenting to British Officers of the Indian Army the prospects of settlement in British Columbia, particularly on the South Okanagan Irrigation Project, and was absent from the province in this connection from the 26th day of March 1922 to the 28th day of August 1922, (156 days) during which time expenses, in addition to transportation to and from India, were incurred for hotel, travelling and subsistence, and rental of halls and other expenses incidental to conducting lectures, amounting to Three Thousand, One Hundred and Sixty-two Dollars and Sixty-seven Cents (\$3,162.67);

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT the sum of Three Thousand, One Hundred and Sixty-two Dollars and Sixty-seven Cents (\$3,162.67) be paid to J.W. Clark to cover such expenses.
