





On the recommendation of the undersigned, the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, orders that the attached declaration of a state of emergency in the Province made by the Minister of Public Safety and Solicitor General on August 15, 2018 is extended for a further period, to the end of the day on September 12, 2018, due to the threat of interface fire affecting the health, safety and welfare of persons and damaging property in the Province.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF PUBLIC
SAFETY AND SOLICITOR GENERAL

Emergency Program Act

Ministerial Order No. M 326

WHEREAS interface fires are threatening lives and property, including a number of residents, homes and other structures such as businesses in the province of British Columbia;

AND WHEREAS this interface fire emergency requires prompt coordination of action or special regulation of persons or property to protect the health, safety or welfare of people or to limit damage to property:


NOW THEREFORE:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED pursuant to Section 9(1) of the *Emergency Program Act* (RSBC 1996, Ch.111) that a state of emergency exists in the Province of British Columbia due to the threat of interface fire affecting lives and property;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, Emergency Management BC, the Fire Commissioner and their employees, servants and agents; the RCMP "E" Division, and "local authorities" within the Province of British Columbia as defined in the *Emergency Program Act*, their employees, servants and agents, are empowered pursuant to Section 10(1) of the *Emergency Program Act*, to do all acts and implement all procedures that are considered necessary to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of the emergency.
