EXECUTIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, VICTORIA 13 FEB. 1976

Upon the recommendation of the undersigned, the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, orders that

WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to designate Heritage Week as a week set aside for citizens to give recognition and to pay special tribute to those articles of our Canadian past in which they can take pride, and which they would preserve and protect for future generations to revere and enjoy:

AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to preserve and protect those remaining signs of the original way of life of the Canadian aboriginal peoples, along with evidence of the impact upon our present by the feats of explorers and adventurers of past years:

AND WHEREAS it is believed that all residents of British Columbia would wish to observe such a week in a manner which would enhance the appreciation of our mutual Canadian heritage by giving thought to our history and by dedicating ourselves throughout the year ahead to the preservation of those articles, buildings and landscapes that provide so much for the enjoyment of present and future generations:

THE WEEK of February 15th to 21st, 1976, inclusive be designated as Heritage Week in British Columbia.

AND THAT the Proclamation appointing, Monday, February 16, 1976 as Heritage Day issued pursuant to the provisions of Order in Council No. 210, approved and ordered January 20, 1976, be recalled.

AND THAT Order in Council No. 210[✓] approved and ordered, January 20, 1976 be rescinded.
