

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:-

THAT timber leases covering lots 273, 275 and 276, Kootenay District situated in the Salmon River Valley in the vicinity of Salmo having expired the lands fell under reserve in conformity with the notice published in the British Columbia Gazette on the 27th December 1907:

THAT the three areas referred to have been subdivided into sixty parcels for the purpose of making the land available for settlement and agricultural use, it having been reported that such land is highly suitable for this purpose being of good quality and convenient to markets:

AND TO RECOMMEND:

THAT the reserve covering the said subdivisions known as Blocks 1 to 42, inclusive, of Lot 273; Blocks 1 to 15, inclusive, of Lot 275 and Blocks 1 to 3, inclusive, of Lot 276, Kootenay District be cancelled under authority of Section 130 of the "Land Act" being Chapter 129, R.S. of B. C. 1911:

AND TO FURTHER RECOMMEND:

THAT the said Blocks 1 to 42, inclusive, of Lot

Lot

273; Blocks 1 to 15, inclusive, of Lot 275 and Blocks 1 to 3, inclusive, of Lot 276, Kootenay District be reserved from sale or other disposition except for the purposes of the "Soldiers' Land Act" Chapter 80, B. C. Statutes 1918, under the authority of Section 3 of the said Act and that by virtue of the authority contained in Section 5 of the said Chapter 80 of 1918 as re-enacted by Section 2, Chapter 76, B. C. Statutes 1919, the said blocks be offered for sale at public auction subject to a suitable upset price. The terms and conditions to be payment of one quarter of the purchase price in cash at the time of sale and the balance in three equal annual installments with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum on deferred payments. Except in the case of returned soldiers as defined in the said Chapter 80 of the B.C. Statutes 1918 who will be required to pay 10% of the purchase price in cash and the balance in ten equal annual installments with interest at 6% per annum on deferred payments and who shall be given a rebate of the purchase price of the land equal to the price per acre for every acre cleared and cultivated within the period of 10 years allowed for completion of the payments, the whole amount of the rebate, however, not to exceed the price of the land.
