

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to REPORT:

THAT Robert Long, Junior, of Rock Bay in the Province of British Columbia, on the twentieth day of March, 1922, died intestate and administration of his estate and effects was granted to Wesley Willard, Official Administrator.

THAT the said deceased was illegitimate, and is survived by his mother, Eliza Long, who is 80 years of age and resides at Old Hill in the County of Stafford, England, and whom he assisted to support and maintain for many years by regular remittances to her.

THAT on the administration of the said estate the sum of \$3324.45, after payment of all costs and charges against the estate, remains in the "Intestate Estates Fund" awaiting distribution by the Administrator.


THAT by reason of the illegitimacy of the said deceased he left no kin or other person entitled to succeed to the said estate and the same thereby escheated to the Crown in the right of the Province of British Columbia.

THAT the said Eliza Long, mother of the said deceased, has a moral claim upon the said deceased and to the said estate monies.


AND TO RECOMMEND that by virtue of Section 7 of the Escheats Act, the said escheat be waived in favour of the said Eliza Long and the amount of the said estate as aforesaid, after payment of all debts, costs and charges, against the said estate, be restored and paid to the said Eliza Long.

AND THAT a certified copy of this minute, if approved, be forwarded to P. Leo Anderton, Official Administrator, at Courtenay, British Columbia.
