The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:-

7 THAT by Order-in-Council #1473 of 1922 it is provided inter alia that each applicant for bounty shall produce the entire pelt of the animal to any Government Agent within six months from the date same was killed:

THAT the Hudson's Bay Company has submitted an application for bounties on four (4) timber wolves which, it is alleged, were killed by Indians on the 1st, 9th and 23rd of December, 1923, but said application for bounties was not made until the 5th day of August, 1924, owing to the districts in which said animals were killed being in a remote part of the Province and it was impossible to present the pelts within the time fixed by the Bounty Regulations:

THAT the said Hudson's Bay Company obtained the pelts of the above mentioned noxious animals and has paid to the said Indians the bounties thereon:

AND TO RECOMMEND THAT the application of the Hudson's Bay Company be accepted, and that the Comptroller-General be authorized to pay a voucher in favour of the said Hudson's Bay Company covering the bounties on Four (4) wolves as set out in said Bounty application taken and declared before J. Mahony, Vancouver, a Commissioner for taking affidavits within the Province of British Columbia.




