To His Honour

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council:

The undersigned has the honour to report:

WHEREAS on or about the 6th day of August, 1923, the Department of Public Works was carrying out certain public works on the boundary line near Metaline Falls, Washington:

AND WHEREAS in the course of such public work a rock was thrown, as the result of a blast, and struck Mrs. T. W. Clark of Spokane, Washington, U.S.A., on the head and injured her to such an extent that a piece of her skull had to be removed necessitating her being in hospital for about one month:

AND WHEREAS negotiations have taken place between the Department and the said Mrs. Clark with regard to her claim for damages with the result that Mrs. Clark has agreed to compromise her claim for the sum of \$1,000.00.

AND TO RECOMMEND that the said compromise be ratified and confirmed and the sum of \$1,000.00 be paid to the said Mrs. T. W. Clark in full settlement of all claims and demands of whatsoever nature or kind arising out and in consequence of the damage which she has suffered in respect to the said injury hereinbefore referred to.
