ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS with campuses located on the Traditional Territories of the Lekwungen and WSÁNAC peoples, Camosun College is one of the largest colleges in British Columbia providing a diverse range of learners with inspiring life-changing learning through a range of academic, access, career and trades programs leading to certificates, diplomas, applied degrees, apprenticeships and post-degree diplomas, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia recognizes Camosun College's strong and well-deserved reputation for its contributions to community, industry and employers alongside the advancement of the social, economic and cultural prosperity of Vancouver Island and the province, and

WHEREAS this year marks the 50th anniversary of Camosun College celebrating its official opening on September 16, 1971, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia remains committed to supporting Camosun College and its dedicated faculty and staff in providing relevant, innovative and applied educational and support services for future generations of Camosun students;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that September 16, 2021, shall be known as

“50th Anniversary of Camosun College”

in the Province of British Columbia.
