A Proclamation

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS on April 24 each year since the 1920s, Armenians have commemorated the victims of the tragic 1915 Armenian genocide, and

WHEREAS on April 24, 1915, hundreds of Armenian poets, musicians, publicists, editors, lawyers and doctors in Constantinople were arrested, exiled and murdered by Ottoman Turkey, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia honours the memories of those who lost their lives as a result of this massacre and their descendants, including the Armenian community in British Columbia, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia recognizes the strength and resilience of the Armenian people, and

WHEREAS Armenian Memorial Day is an opportunity for British Columbians to reflect on historic injustices while raising awareness about the many forms of racism, injustices, discrimination and hate disproportionately suffered by minority communities;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that April 24, 2021, shall be known as

“Armenian Memorial Day”

in the Province of British Columbia.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our Province of British Columbia to be hereunto affixed.

WITNESS, The Honourable Janet Austin, Lieutenant Governor of Our Province of British Columbia, in Our City of Victoria, in Our Province, this first day of April, two thousand twenty-one and in the seventieth year of Our Reign.
