ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS British Columbia's creative industries—motion picture, music, book and magazine publishing, and interactive and digital media industries—employ thousands of skilled professionals to produce a wide range of innovative and interconnected products and services, and

WHEREAS British Columbia's creative industries contribute significantly to the economic, social, artistic and cultural identity of British Columbia, and

WHEREAS British Columbia's creative industries support the advancement of equity, diversity and inclusion for all people in British Columbia, and

WHEREAS British Columbia's creative industries contribute significantly to British Columbia's profile on the world stage, driving growth in entertainment, technology, education, tourism and hospitality sectors, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia recognizes the partnership between businesses, government, Indigenous partners and the local community, all working together to build a sustainable and competitive creative economy that will continue to employ new generations of British Columbians;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that May 16 to 20, 2022, shall be known as

“Creative Industries Week”

in the Province of British Columbia.
