ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS Diversity and Acceptance Day (Pink Shirt Day) highlights the commitment to make British Columbia a safe and inclusive province, and

WHEREAS acts of bullying, discrimination, harassment, intimidation and violence have a profound effect on an individual's feelings of safety and self-worth and ability to learn, and

WHEREAS acts of bullying, discrimination, harassment, intimidation and violence are unacceptable in a safe, caring and orderly society, and

WHEREAS Diversity and Acceptance Day (Pink Shirt Day) is an opportunity to recognize efforts to build communities that foster respect, inclusion, fairness, equity and compassion, and

WHEREAS Diversity and Acceptance Day (Pink Shirt Day) is an opportunity to actively promote respectful and kind behaviour, and

WHEREAS Diversity and Acceptance Day (Pink Shirt Day) is an occasion to celebrate the actions of individuals, schools, communities and sports organizations to address bullying, discrimination, harassment, intimidation and violence;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that February 24, 2021, shall be known as

“Diversity and Acceptance Day (Pink Shirt Day)”

in the Province of British Columbia.
