A Proclamation

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS motor vehicle collisions are one of the leading causes of unintentional injury and death across all ages in British Columbia, and

WHEREAS speeding, distracted driving and impaired driving are the leading contributing factors for motor vehicle collisions, and

WHEREAS injuries and deaths caused by motor vehicle crashes are preventable and fundamentally a public safety issue, and

WHEREAS British Columbia has aligned its Road Safety Strategy with Canada's Road Safety Strategy 2015, and aims to continue to reduce fatalities and serious injuries caused by motor vehicle crashes, and

WHEREAS British Columbia's goal is to have the safest roads in North America, working with road safety partners across the province to achieve Vision Zero, the ultimate goal of eliminating motor vehicle crash fatalities and serious injuries, and

WHEREAS the National Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims is held in Canada on the third Wednesday in November each year;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that November 20, 2019, shall be known as

“Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims”

in the Province of British Columbia.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our Province of British Columbia to be hereunto affixed.
