A Proclamation

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS the Province of British Columbia recognizes inclusive communities as an integral aspect of the province's goal to make British Columbia a better place for people with disabilities, and

WHEREAS the province is committed to the ideal of an inclusive society based on respect and understanding where Indigenous persons (First Nations, Métis, Inuit) living with disabilities and the significant contributions they provide are celebrated and valued, and

WHEREAS the province is committed to upholding and safeguarding the principles outlined in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, including full and effective participation and inclusion in society, equality of opportunity, and the United Nations recommendation to the Government of Canada to proclaim and recognize November each year as Indigenous Disability Awareness Month, and

WHEREAS Indigenous persons living with disabilities in British Columbia often face unique barriers that impact their ability to fully participate in the social and economic opportunities available in our province, and

WHEREAS the Government of British Columbia wishes to join urban and rural Indigenous communities, disability organizations, individuals with disabilities and their families and all British Columbians in recognizing and celebrating this diverse and important segment of our society, and

WHEREAS the province is committed to fully adopting and implementing the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action, and will be reviewing policies, programs and legislation to determine how to bring these into action in British Columbia;

NOW KNOW YE THAT, We do by these presents proclaim and declare that November 2018 shall be known as


“Indigenous Disability Awareness Month”
