ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS British Columbia is committed to putting in place laws, regulations and policies backed by strong prevention and enforcement measures that support workplaces in today's economy, and

WHEREAS a working environment that treats people with respect and dignity no matter their race, gender, abilities or economic status is essential to the health, safety and well-being of every worker in British Columbia;

NOW KNOW YE THAT, We do by these presents proclaim and declare that May 1, 2019 shall be known as


“International Workers' Day”

in the Province of British Columbia.


