A Proclamation

CHARLES THE THIRD, by the Grace of God, King of Canada
and His other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS motor vehicle collisions are one of the leading causes of unintentional injury and death across all ages in British Columbia, and

WHEREAS speeding, distracted driving and impaired driving are the leading contributing factors for motor vehicle collisions, and

WHEREAS injuries and deaths caused by motor vehicle crashes are preventable and fundamentally a public safety issue, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia has aligned the BC Road Safety Strategy with Canada's Road Safety Strategy 2025 and aims to continue reducing fatalities and serious injuries caused by motor vehicle crashes, and

WHEREAS the government of British Columbia's goal is to have the safest roads in North America, by working with road safety partners across the province to achieve Vision Zero: eliminating motor vehicle crash fatalities and serious injuries, and

WHEREAS the third Wednesday in November each year is the National Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims in Canada;

NOW KNOW YE THAT We do by these presents proclaim and declare that November 20, 2024, shall be known as


“Day of Remembrance for Road Crash Victims”

in the Province of British Columbia.


