ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS those who have English heritage, tradition and customs are an important and integral part of daily life to the benefit of British Columbian society, and

WHEREAS we draw our parliamentary traditions in British Columbia from English tradition, and

WHEREAS those who immigrated from Britain demonstrated dedication and hard work which contributed greatly to the history of the province, and

WHEREAS those of the English community throughout British Columbia continue to make valuable contributions to our society, and

WHEREAS we in the multicultural province of British Columbia respect the importance of celebrating our customs and heritage, and

WHEREAS those of English heritage throughout the world mark April 23 with a civic and festive celebration to revere and honour St. George, the Patron Saint of England, for his courage and his contribution to all things English;

NOW KNOW YE THAT, We do by these presents proclaim and declare that April 23, 2018 shall be known as


“St. George Day”
