ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom,
Canada and Her other Realms and Territories, Queen, Head of the
Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith

To all to whom these presents shall come – Greeting

WHEREAS British Columbia is the most ethnically diverse province in Canada, where individuals respect and learn from different cultures and traditions, and

WHEREAS there are more than 38 000 Taiwanese Canadians in the province of British Columbia, with a significant population in Vancouver, who have made enormous contributions to the diversity and prosperity of the province, and

WHEREAS members of the Taiwanese Canadian Cultural Society, a federally registered non-profit charitable organization, have successfully contributed, since the Society's inception in 1991, to the promotion of relations, cultural exchange and settlement services, and

WHEREAS, during this special day, the Taiwanese Canadian Cultural Society will host the Taiwanese Canadian Cultural Festival, showcasing an exchange of visual art, music and dance between Taiwan and Canada that will embrace British Columbia's diversity and celebrate the spirit of cultural exchange that binds us together as a province;

NOW KNOW YE THAT, We do by these presents proclaim and declare that July 12, 2019 shall be known as


“Taiwan-Canada Culture Exchange Day”

in the Province of British Columbia.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our Province of British Columbia to be hereunto affixed.
